





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## **PROGRAM NOTES**

The much-loved Christmas carol *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, with text by American priest Phillips Brooks, exists with two melodies: the ST LOUIS melody, by Lewis Redner, which is traditional and most popular in the USA, and the FORREST GREEN melody, by Ralph Vaughan-Williams which is more common in the UK and Europe. This melody first appeared in the English Hymnal in 1906 and has been immortalized ever since. The opening and closing piano accompaniment of this arrangement are conceived to imitate the sound of distant sleigh-bells.

This arrangement was first composed and performed in 2009 as a solo by mezzo-soprano Mairéad Maguire and Niall Kinsella on piano, and was adapted in 2016 for two part upper voice choir while using the same piano accompaniment.

## ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Irish Pianist and Choral Conductor **Niall Kinsella** studied at the University of Music and Performing Arts, Vienna, Austria, and at the Royal Irish Academy of Music, Dublin, Ireland. He has studied extensively and has performed as an accompanist throughout Europe. His debut CD, of the Complete Songs of Irish composer John F. Larchet was released internationally on Champs Hill Records (UK). As a choral accompanist, Niall has collaborated with Chamber Choir Ireland, RTÉ Cór na nÓg, The Webern Kammerchor der MDW, and choirs of the Wiener Chorschule (Vienna). He has also accompanied both concerts and conducting masterclasses of the famed Maestra Dr. Doreen Rao.

As a conductor, Niall has conducted many of Western Europes major choral works. In 2014-15, Niall was selected as Association of Irish Choirs / RTÉ Conductor-in-Training, and was the assistant conductor to the RTÉ Philharmonic Choir and conducted Irish Youth Choir.
